The first global service campaign:

The four Global Service Action Campaigns will show the strength of our association and offer more people the opportunity to realize their service spirit through Lions Club membership. The first campaign, Shine a Light on Youth, is already upon us. Scheduled for August to coincide with United Nations World Youth Day (August 12), it gives your clubs the opportunity to connect with young people in ways they can relate to. It will also shine a light on what young people can accomplish and harness the energy and idealism of youth for Lions Clubs projects. make the most of this opportunity, planning efforts should include young people, especially Leos. Projects should have visible youth involvement and focus on hands-on service activities such as:

- Engaging young people, including Leos, in serving vulnerable youth
- Organizing a youth forum or town hall meeting to highlight topics that youth have identified as critical community issues,
- Assisting at camps serving children with special needs,
- Organizing a book drive for a community center, children's after-school center, hospital facility or school library.

## Partnership Aims to Prevent Childhood Blindness

A new partnership program with the Bausch + Lomb Early Vision Institute was announced during the International Convention in Sydney, Australia. The partnership program, The Pediatric Cataract Initiative, will seek out and fund innovative, replicable programs to prevent and treat cataract in infants and children while promoting early childhood vision screenings. Bausch + Lomb contributed US\$350,000 in the pilot year to launch the program.
